

Concept Note – Internal workshop - PFAS

Monday, 18 March 2024, 14h00-15h30 Online via Teams

The objective of this workshop is to discuss the issue of PFAS and their management on a broader European level. Starting with a brief presentation of the results of the critical review carried out by Prof. Pivato of the University of Padua on the 4 selected waste streams, we will explore the more general issue of the management of all PFAS-containing waste with a presentation by Nicolas Humez (SARP Industries and FNADE).

The presentations will provide food for thought for discussion among all participants who will be invited to share their views in order to trigger a debate within FEAD. This will allow us to continue the work we started last year and expand it to include aspects that were not addressed in the study. In this way, the discussion will serve as a basis for defining a position for our association and the entire waste management sector.
