### **Global Gateway – What is it?**

\* \* \* \* Global \* Gateway

- A new European strategy to boost smart, clean and secure links in digital, energy and transport sectors and to strengthen health, education and research systems across the world.
- An EU principles and value-based offer to partner countries to position the EU more prominently in a competitive world.
- The EU's contribution to narrowing the global investment gap worldwide, fully aligned with the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the Paris Agreement.

### **Global Gateway – What is it?**

### **Global Gateway:**

- Reflects a change in the way the EU approaches its external action, combining the needs of partner countries with a stronger assessment of the EU's strategic interests.
- Implemented by Team Europe, mainly through Team Europe Initiatives.
- Whole-of-government approach expected: EC, EIB, EBRD, all relevant EU Member States ministries, developments agencies, development finance institutions, export credit agencies, and the private sector.

### **Global Gateway – Investment mobilisation**

EU and EU Member States will **mobilise up to €300 billion in investments** (2021 – 2027).

Investments will be mobilised through a Team Europe approach and **with the private sector**.

\*EFSD+ (European Fund for Sustainable Development Plus - <u>link) is the main EU risk-sharing instrument</u>.

### Flagship example – Clean-up of the Hann Bay

First large-scale industrial depollution operation in West Africa by **collection and treatment of effluent** before discharge into the sea while introducing the **polluter pays principle** 

**Benefits:** Improved ecological state of the bay and the living conditions of the population

**Expected cost:** € 187.6 M

#### Stakeholders involved:

- State of Senegal (€10.5 M)
- European Union (€29.4 M in grants)
- AFD (€83.3 M in grants and loans)
- Netherlands-based Invest International (€50 M in grants and loans)
- Chinese Development Bank (€14.4 M in loans)

### Flagship example – Hann Bay Clean-up

Tasks and Works Contracts: International Open Call for Tenders under management of ONAS - National Sanitation Office of Senegal

- **EIFFAGE SADE** / Lot 1: Construction of an **interceptor** (15 km of networks and 7 pumping stations) € 29.3 M
- SUEZ CDE / Lot 2: Construction of a wastewater treatment plant with a capacity of 25,000 m3/day (primary, secondary treatment, biogas, and cogeneration) € 68.7 M
- VAN OORD / Lot 3: Construction of a 2 km sea outfall / 20 million EUR
- **SVTD-GC** / Lot 4: Construction of **secondary networks** to connect the industries of the Bay (15 km) € 3.5 M
- WIETC/ Lot 5: Canal VI dewatering works / € 4.7 M
- CSE / Lot 6: Construction of secondary networks to connect households (30 km) / € 14.4 M
- Pending Award / Lot 7: Sanitation of the Autonomous Port of Dakar (20 km of wastewater networks, 5 lift stations, 1 pumping station, 8 km of drainage networks/canals) € 14.9 M



### Flagship example – Clean-up the Bay of Hann

#### **Opportunities:**

- **To be Launched** / Lot 8: Installation of **pretreatment units** for industries whose effluents do not meet the discharge standards in the network / € 6.5 M
- Opportunity : Selection of a private operator for the operation of the wastewater treatment plant (modalities under definition)

### EU Toolbox – EFSD+

#### **European Fund for Sustainable Development Plus – EFSD+**

- De-risking financial tool to increase private and public sector investment
- Offers a variety of **risk-sharing instruments** of up to **€40 billion** (€ 27 bn + €13 bn)
- Aims to **mobilise up to €135 billion** of public and private sustainable investments in EU's partner countries
- offered on favourable, highly competitive conditions

#### **EFSD+ instruments** include:

- **1. Unfunded guarantees** of loans, off-take agreements, equity, capital markets operations, etc.
- 2. Blending: mix of grants and loans

### EU Toolbox – EFSD+ Guarantees

### What is a guarantee?



The guarantee is therefore NOT a grant.

### EU Toolbox – EFSD+ Guarantees

#### WINDOW 1

**Implementer**: EIB only **Budget**: €27 bn

Sovereign & non-commercial sub-sovereign

#### **Beneficiary**:

Government and entities fully backed by state unable to finance themselves in the market.

#### Examples:

Large infrastructure projects (e.g. metro, hospital, port)

#### WINDOW 2 - Open Architecture

**Implementer**: financial partners selected through call for applications **Budget**: €13 bn

#### **Commercial sub-sovereign**

#### **Beneficiary**:

Public entity able to finance themselves in the market.

#### Beneficiary: Private sector

Private sector companies from SMEs to large companies.

**Private sector** 

#### Examples:

- Loan to public water and sanitation company.
- Upgrading capacity of national utility company

#### Examples:

- SME credit line
- Solar off-grid project
- Support to cocoa producers

#### How can you access guarantees?

<u>Indirectly</u> through local financial institutions (in the partner country) or through contacting the lead financial institutions (DFI).

### **EFSD+ Guarantees**

### **Example of guarantee:**

Financing and Accelerating the Sustainable Transition of Cities (FAST-Cities) :

**Access to finance for intermediate cities** through the direct or intermediate lending including capacity building and project preparation

Achieve urban sustainable investments in **waste disposal**, housing, **water and sanitation** or transportation, all contributing to the **mitigation or adaptation to climate change**.

**Investment portfolio:** € 243 833 333

**<u>Pipeline of possible operations:</u>** Waste management and wastewater treatment projects in **Ecuador** and one transport project in **Colombia**

### EU Toolbox - EFSD+ Blending

EFSD+ blending are grants and loans to support non-bankable investment projects in EU partner countries. It can attract additional financing.
It is done through a Financial partner – Pillar Assessed (notably European Development Finance Institutions)

### **Types** of financial support through blending:

- Direct investment grant
- Technical assistance grant
- Risk capital
- Funded guarantee
- Interest rate subsidy grant

- Reduce cost to end users or beneficiary country
- Provide technical support
  - Invest to lower investors' risk perception
  - Guarantee certain types of investments
  - Reduce interest cost

### EU Toolbox - EFSD+ Blending

#### **Example of Blending:**

Public financial partner - Clean up the Bay of Hann

**Private financial partner – Climate Investor 2** 





#### Financing for the entire lifecycle of a project

- Access to safe drinking water for 8 million people in developing countries
- ✓ Access to wastewater treatment for 4 million people in developing countries
- 115 MW of renewable energy capacity producing 1,200GWh per year from the use of wastes, sludges and wastewaters

### EU Toolbox - EFSD+ Blending

**Private financial partner – Climate Investor 2:** Tubig – A clean water platform in the Philippines

**76 MLD of potable water** to **270 000 people** residing in underserved communities in towns outside Metro Manila

Climate Investor 2 participation will raise Tubig Pilipinas Group Inc standards and compliance as a water platform, especially in environmental and social aspects.

#### Expected cost: \$58 M

- **Impact:** Improvements in water service delivery
  - Non-revenue water (NRW) reduction
  - Introduction of septage treatment services
  - Jobs creation in operations and construction

## EU Toolbox - Cooperation with ECAs and DFIs

#### New Commission Expert Group on Enhanced Coordination of External Financial Tools

- **Objective**: platform for exchange of information and potential coordination in specific transactions between the EIB, ECAs and DFIs in order to improve competitiveness of the EU export industry and to contribute to EU policy goals (Global Gateway, green and digital transition, etc.)
- **Members**: EIB, ECAs, DFIs, ministries responsible for ECAs (export support) and DFIs (development support). Observers: **industry** associations (specific companies can be invited as ad-hoc experts).
- First meeting: 18 January 2024 (followed by a public seminar on 19 January).
- Chaired by the Commission (TRADE and INTPA co-chairs), other DGs (in particular NEAR), EEAS associated as necessary.

### EU Toolbox - Trade and investment agreements

Trade and investment agreements contribute to **improving the business environment** in partner countries.

Agreements bring benefits such as:

- boost trade in goods and create new economic opportunities
- incentivise EU investment, thanks to increased legal certainty and stability
- contain strong trade and sustainability commitments

Example: EU-Kenya Economic Partnership Agreement (negotiations concluded in July 2023)
