Though the Commissioners received backing by a majority of MEPs, it was a slim one, at best. But according to various media assessments, at least one person emerged victorious: Manfred Weber, the President of the EPP, now dubbed the maker of kings, or maybe the king of makers?

You know what they say though, heavy is the head that wears the crown, and if we correctly understood the thinly veiled threats made during the speeches by the different political groups, the crown is getting heavier by the day...



College of Commissioners: On 27 November, during a European Parliament <u>plenary</u> <u>session</u>, MEP's <u>voted</u> in favour of the new College of Commissioners. The vote took place after Commission President, Ursula von der Leyen, addressed the Parliament stating that 'European sovereignty is not for sale' and that the European budget is often 'too complex, funding the same thing in different projects'.

New collective quantified goal on climate finance - COP29 Declaration: At COP29, governments signed an <u>agreement</u> on climate finance.

International Plastic Treaty Fifth Intergovernmental Negotiating Committee (INC-

5): The plenary of the 5th negotiation session took place on 25 November and included discussions on the committee Chair's proposal to use his '<u>non-paper</u>' as a basis for negotiations. However, despite the EU's <u>commitment</u> to 'concluding the negotiations and engaging with other parties to achieve the treaty's conclusion by the end of the year', the <u>negotiations</u> ended without an agreement but a follow-up session has been planned.

INC-5 - Statement by Civil Society and Rights Holders Coalition on Room Capacity

Issues: On 26 November, members of the Civil Society and Rights Holders Coalition (which represents more than 200 organisations) published a <u>statement</u> in which they condemned the organisation of the INC-5 in Busan.

Packaging and Packaging Waste Regulation (PPWR): On 26 November 2024, the European Parliament plenary received the Corrigendum to the first reading position on the proposal to revise the PPWR. Since no objection was raised by any political group within the 24 hours period, the <u>Corrigendum</u> is considered approved.

JRC technical proposals on EU-wide end-of-waste criteria for plastic waste: The Joint Research Center (JRC) published on 25 November <u>technical proposals</u> on EU-wide end-of-waste criteria for plastic waste.

OECD report on Plastic Pollution: On 2 October, the OECD published a <u>report</u> titled 'Policy Scenarios for Eliminating Plastic Pollution by 2040'. The report investigates the potential benefits and consequences of varying levels of international policy ambition to tackle plastic pollution.

Stagnation in plastic recycling capacities: On 27 November, Plastics Recyclers Europe **<u>published</u>** market data which shows stagnation in plastic recycling capacities.

The future of European Electric vehicles - European Parliament paper: On 22 November, the European Parliament think tank published a <u>paper</u> on 'The future of European Electric vehicles'. This paper provides an overview of EU-China competition in

6th Trilateral Business Forum Joint Declaration: The presidents of the MEDEF, BDI and Confindustria (the French, German and Italian associations for employers and industries) released a **joint statement** resulting from their 6th Trilateral Business Forum in which they call for the rescue of European competitiveness by focusing on technological neutrality.

Polish Presidency - Press team: Politico <u>reports</u> that Beata Mączka joined the Polish perm rep's press team as deputy spokesperson for Coreper I.

European Commission - Philippe Lamberts role: On 25 November, the European Commission <u>announced</u> in a press release that the Belgian Philippe Lambert, former Co-leader of the Greens/EFA group in the European Parliament will play a advisory role to the Commission President, to help support the transition to a climate-neutral economy.

European Commission - Cabinet of Democracy Commissioner: <u>RTÉ</u> reports that Fiona Knab-Lunny, who is currently in Josep Borrell's Cabinet, will head the Cabinet of incoming Irish Commissioner Michael McGrath.

cabinet: Politico <u>reports</u> Clara de Melo Ponce, the Renew group's spokesperson, started this month as a member of Cabinet for European Parliament Secretary-General Alessandro Chiocchetti.
