Between the Polish Presidency, the European Parliament's ten issues to watch for and the Competitiveness compass, 2025 is already shaping up to be another busy year!



Polish Presidency agenda: The Polish Presidency published its <u>draft agenda</u> still relying on the Commission's timetable.

Council of the EU: During the 8 January meeting, the Commission <u>debriefed</u> the industry attachés on the Net Zero Emission Industry (NZIA) Regulation.

European Parliament's 10 issues to watch in 2025: The European Parliamentary

Circular Material Use Rate (CMUR) in Europe: On 6 January, the European Environmental Agency (EEA) **<u>published</u>** additional data on the CMUR in Europe.

2035 climate target: On 8 January, the European Commissioner for Climate Action, Wopke Hoekstra, assured in a Reuters <u>interview</u> that the EU will finalize an 'ambitious number' for its climate commitments before COP30 in Belém, Brazil, scheduled for November 2025.

European Central Bank (ECB) report on green investments: On 8 January, the ECB published a <u>report</u> that shows that Europe's green investments are far from meeting the 2030 climate target.

Carbon border adjustment mechanism (CBAM): On 18 December 2024, the Commission <u>adopted</u> the implementing act that regulates the CBAM registry.

Olaf Scholz's letter to Von Der Leyen on high electricity prices: On 2 January, in a <u>letter</u> addressed to Ursula von der Leyen, the German Chancellor Olaf Scholz called on the European Commission to 'create the conditions for extending electricity price compensation and broadening its scope at least until 2030'.

Electricity price drops down from 2023 to 2024: On 2 January, Eurelectric, representing the EU electricity sector, published <u>new data</u> on the composition of the EU's electricity generation and the technologies contributing to it.

Taxonomy: On 8 January 2025, the <u>Platform on Sustainable Financepublished</u> a draft <u>report</u> on preliminary recommendations for the review of the Climate Delegated Act and the addition of activities to the <u>EU taxonomy</u>.

Competitiveness compass: The European Commission has warned that the competitiveness compass may not be presented at the College meeting on 15 January, Politico <u>reports</u>, due to the pneumonia suffered by the President of the Commission, Ursula von der Leyen.

EU - Japan strategic partnership: On 1 January, the first-ever bilateral <u>framework</u> <u>agreement</u> between the EU and Japan, the Strategic Partnership Agreement (SPA), entered into force.

EU and Switzerland energy agreements: The EU Commission and Switzerland <u>agreed</u> that Switzerland will incorporate the EU's rules on the internal electricity market into its legislative framework. To be validated, this agreement needs

the European Parliament and the Council's approval.

Bisphenol A ban in food packaging: The delegated act validated by Member States in June 2024 has been **<u>published</u>** in the Official Journal of the EU on 31 December 2024.
