Waste Shipment Regulation (WSR): According to the EU Issue Tracker, the European Parliament and Council will hold a 3rd round of Trilogue on 16 November.

Soil Monitoring Law (SML): Rapporteur Martin Hojsik (Renew, Slovakia), drafted a <u>report</u> where he introduces the possibility to set intermediate goals for 2040 on Soil health following an evaluation by the Commission.

FEAD has provided **feedback** to the public consultation on SML.

Renewable Energy Directive (RED): On 31 October, the RED was <u>published</u> in the EU Official Journal. It will enter into force on 20 November 2023.

Certification of sustainable Bioenergy: On 24 October, the Commission published a <u>report</u> on bioenergy which states that a study on the certification of sustainable bioenergy sources according to RED will be launched at the end of 2023.

Eco-design for Sustainable products Regulation (ESPR): According to the EU issue Tracker, IMCO Committee is scheduled to meet on 13 November to be debriefed by David Cormand (Greens, France) on the status of the Trilogue.

Chemical substances: On 25 October, REACH experts met to discuss PFHxA and the June restriction proposal by the Commission. PFHxA can be found in clothes, packaging, and carpets.

ECHA CARACAL Cross check (Xcheck): ECHA has launched a consultation for CARACAL members (also known as the competent authorities for REACH and CLP) and the European Commission to verify that their comments are sufficiently taken into account by ECHA.

International plastic treaty: The fourth session of the Intergovernmental Negotiating Committee is scheduled to take place at the Shaw Centre in Ottawa, Canada, within the period 21 to 30 April 2024 inclusive of one day for regional consultations.

EFRAG ESRS: The EFRAG ESRS Q&A platform to support the implementation of ESRS has <u>launched</u>.

European Green Bonds: The Council has <u>adopted</u> a Regulation to create a European Green Bond standard.

Intelligent Transport Systems (ITS): The Council has <u>adopted</u> a new framework to boost the roll-out of ITS by revising the 2010 Directive. The revision will be published in the Journal in the coming weeks.

Hydrogen: The European Policy center <u>warns</u> against excessive subventions of Hydrogen as proposed by the Commission.

Methodology for the reporting of projected emissions of certain atmospheric pollutants: On 27 October, the European Commission published a draft <u>delegated</u> directive that amends Annexes I and IV of Directive (EU) 2016/2284 on the reduction of national emissions of certain atmospheric pollutants emissions.

List of essential services: On 30 October, the Commission's <u>delegated</u>

Regulation establishing a list of essential services to supplement Directive (EU) 2022/2557 was published in the Official Journal of the EU.

Green Deal: Maroš Šefčovič, new Commissioner for the European Green Deal, has stated in a Financial Times <u>interview</u> on 29 October that he may be open to a fourth mandate at

the European Commission if it is focused on the Green Deal.

Belgian Presidency: <u>Contexte</u> has obtained and published the latest version of the upcoming Belgian Presidency's meetings calendar.

The United Nations: The UN's program for the Environment <u>published</u> a report that states that the financing needs of developing countries for the climate change are 10 to 18 higher than current financing.

PFAS in the waste sector

The European Chemical Agency (ECHA) presented a report on the presence of PFAS in waste streams in April. This report states that the chemical should be massively restricted, even though it is already largely regulated. This restriction could have a major impact on the waste sector. In order to give Member States a clearer view of the situation, FEAD is performing, in collaboration with the University of Padova, a systematic critical review of the scientific literature to collect PFAS concentration ranges in waste items categorized within the relevant four waste categories: plastic waste; paper and cardboard waste; textile and leather waste; and metal waste. The conference on Wednesday the 8, will provide the results of the first part of this study.

The event will start with two 20-minute presentations: one of the report by ECHA and the second one the results of the Critical review. A panel discussion will follow, featuring high-level experts in different area of this field. A Q&A with the public will close the event.


